Payment Reform: The Significance of 2018 for Leading Health Systems

Large, integrated health systems have been particularly ambitious in embracing the transition to value-based care, with many concurrently participating in multiple risk-based payment models with Medicare and other governmental and non-governmental payers. The passage of the Medicare Access and CHIP Reauthorization Act (MACRA) in 2015 and the creation of the Quality Payment Program (QPP) hastened this shift to value-based care; however, MACRA is one element of a broader payment reform effort by the federal government. Leading health systems are rethinking physician alignment strategies, altering physician compensation, and developing innovative contracts to promote value across all government payers.

The Academy Government Payer Collaborative: Partnering to Prepare Leading Health Systems for Value-Based Payment

Leading Health Systems will require both knowledge and tactical expertise to prepare for broad-reaching changes through payment reform. The Academy, through its policy, advisory, research, and convening functions, will partner with Leading Health Systems around value-based payment through MACRA, Medicare Advantage, Medicaid, and other Governmental Payers. The Academy Government Payer Collaborative, led by The Academy Advisors, builds on the subject matter expertise of Academy professionals and the Top-100 peer-learning and collaboration. The Collaborative is designed to be a multi-disciplinary forum, with teams of individuals across functions participating from each health system.

Collaborative Focus

As you position your organization for success in 2018 and beyond, The Academy Government Payer Collaborative will provide a forum to acquire knowledge, develop strategies, and collaborate with Leading Health System peers.

Membership in The Academy Government Payer Collaborative will include participation at two in-person meetings in June and November of 2018, as well as quarterly member-driven webinars, and 25 relevant policy briefings. The biannual meetings will focus on the following:

Education

- Educational sessions covering the structure and function of emerging payment models, to include new ACO models, bundled payment models, medical home models, Medicare Advantage models, managed Medicaid and others.
- Context around the broader health policy and political landscape in Washington D.C. impacting value-based payment trends.

Strategic Planning

- Discussions with both The Academy and outside experts around the tactical considerations regarding contracting with payers, network design, workflow development, and physician compensation in a value-based world.
- Breakout opportunities for health system teams to discuss their own organizational strategies with The Academy's subject matter experts.

Peer Collaboration

- Breakout sessions, facilitated by The Academy's subject matter experts to compare implementation strategies around value based payment programs.
- Health system-led discussions around best practices for approaching the shift towards value-based care.

An Adaptive Approach

The Academy launched the MACRA Collaborative in 2016 at the request of provider organizations attempting to better understand the payment landscape and collaborate with peers from around the country on new payment models. In speaking with many MACRA Collaborative participants, we believe now is an opportune time to broaden the focus of the Collaborative and include other government reimbursement models, while maintaining the same learning and collaborative environment that allowed the MACRA Collaborative to be successful.


